

## **LEADER Residential Voyage Kit List**

- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Waterproof boots (like wellies or hiking boots)
- Warm waterproof jacket and a hoodie, fleece or jumper
- T-shirts (long sleeve and short sleeve)
- 2 pairs of trousers (You can wear jeans but not recommended while sailing)
- Underwear, warm socks and some pyjamas
- Warm hat and gloves (beanie hats are ideal)
- Towel, big enough to dry you after a shower
- Wash kit (no aerosols/sprays, roll on deodorants are best)
- Plastic bag to store any clothes that get wet

### OPTIONAL

- Camera
- Head torch
- Sunglasses, sun cream
- Wet wipes
- Travel sickness medicine
- Pocket money (less than £20)
- Some snacks you like, but no energy drinks
- Small bag for going ashore
- Portable battery charger for your phone

It can feel very cold and windy when you're on deck, so it's best to have a few layers you can put on/take off as required instead of just one big jacket and some t-shirts.

You can bring your phone, but it should only be used when not inferring with the running of the boat. Check with the Skipper if you aren't sure.

### **NO SUITCASES**

Pack everything in a soft, squishy bag, like a sports holdall or rucksack. Max 80L

### **MEDICATION**

Make sure you have enough to last the voyage. Medication should be clearly labelled, with full details written on your booking form

### **LEAVE VALUABLES AT HOME**

No games consoles, laptops or other expensive electric gadgets
